- Pre-conference: Home Energy CoP Meeting

HERA members who are also involved in the Home Energy Project have an opportunity to participate in a pre-conference work session. Contact Shirley Neimeyer for more information.

- Pre-conference A: At home in the World

Join 2010 HERA President Ann Ziebarth to explore international housing issues. Share resources for teaching. Discuss opportunities for research and collaborative projects.

- Pre-conference B: Indoor Air Contaminants & Health Effects

Harriet M. Ammann, PhD will provide an overview of current research on indoor air quality issues. Join the discussion of the allergy and asthma responses to exposure to damp and moldy environments and other indoor air quality problems.

- *Imaging Home* at New Columbia

Preview the New Columbia HOPE VI urban redevelopment project through the virtual reality of film during our lunch on Thursday. Through the family stories we discover the reality of demolition, displacement and relocation for residents of the old Columbia Villa. Filmmaker Richard Wilhelm will join us to share his experience working with the residents. Later in the day we will take a bus tour to see affordable housing developments in Portland, including New Columbia.

With 27 years of experience in land use planning issues and the Executive Director for 1000 Friend of Oregon, the nation's oldest statewide Smart Growth advocacy organization, our keynote speaker, Robert Liberty is an expert on planning issues. He will share his knowledge of metropolitan planning and redevelopment in town centers and along main streets, increasing transportation and housing choices while conserving natural areas. Its out chance to learn more about Oregon's efforts to give citizens a stronger role in the regional planning decisions that affect our future.

Are you currently doing housing research? Have a project idea in the works? Do you supervise research projects or service learning experiences with students? Here's a wonderful professional development opportunity talk about research challenges to brush up on your research ethics. Many of our Human Subjects Review requirements include professional development refresher certification. Here is your chance to work out sticky issues, think about

vulnerable research subjects, and discuss the ethics of the work we do—from selecting our research, defining the questions, to collecting data, and reporting the results.
