

ERRATA

In Richard A. Kaiser's article, "New Directions in Federal Housing Policy," in v.1,n.1 (May 1974) of *Housing Educators Journal*, a housing program was incorrectly named due to a typographical error. The paragraph (from page 7) should read:

We would administer one of the existing programs — Section 23 Construction for Leasing — to make maximum use of the freedom of choice principle inherent in the concept of direct cash assistance. Eventually, with Congressional authorization of our proposed new construction program, we would expand the development and ownership of projects under Section 23 to private builders.

In Gertrude Fish's article "Residential Homogeneity and Neighborhood Interaction," in v.1,n.1 (May 1974) of *Housing Educators Journal*, credit should have been given to the New York State Urban Development Corporation for partial support of the research. In some copies of the issue containing this article minus signs were omitted from Figures 1, 2, 3, and 4 on pages 16-18. (These errors were corrected in all copies mailed.) The text is correct, e.g., the text description of Figure 2 states: "Length of time married, type of structure, and satisfaction with neighborhood all have negative influences on propensity to move." Therefore, in Figure 2, the numbers on the arrows between FLC and MOVE, SINGL and MOVE, and NHDSAT and MOVE should each be preceded by minus signs. Complete corrections of Figures 1, 2, 3 and 4 may be obtained from the editors.
