TESSIE AGAN SCHOLARSHIPS ESTABLISHED

Tessie Agan, the first president of AAHE, was present at the tenth annual meeting in Fort Collins when it was announced that three scholarships will be awarded in her honor. The three \$75 scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis to help students attend the annual AAHE meeting in Columbus, Ohio, October 12-16, 1976. Any student who is currently pursuing an emphasis related to housing, and who will be a student Fall, 1976, is eligible to apply. Application forms should be requested by February 1, 1976, from Ruth Eaton, Department of Home Economics, University of Minnesota-Duluth, Duluth, Minnesota, 55812. Applicants should submit by June 15, 1976, an original essay or research report related to housing, not to exceed 20 double spaced typed pages. Papers will be judged on the basis of originality, clarity, literary form, and contribution to the field of housing. The three papers selected will be submitted for publication consideration in the *Housing Educators Journal*.
